The Fort Wayne Museum of Art

311 E Main St, Fort Wayne, IN 46802

Located on Main Street in downtown Fort Wayne, the Fort Wayne Museum of Art is a contemporary art museum and is part of the growing Fort Wayne Cultural District. Visit their galleries featuring American and related art from the 19th century to today.

Lakeside Park & Rose Garden

Take a stroll through Lakeside Rose Garden. It is one of the largest rose gardens in the entire United States with over 2,000 roses on display.

River Greenway

Historic Old Fort

History is brought to life at the Old Fort in Fort Wayne. It is a replica of the fort built by American troops under the command of Major John Whistler in 1815-1816. The original fort was widely regarded as one of the "most sophisticated all-wooden forts ever built in North America."

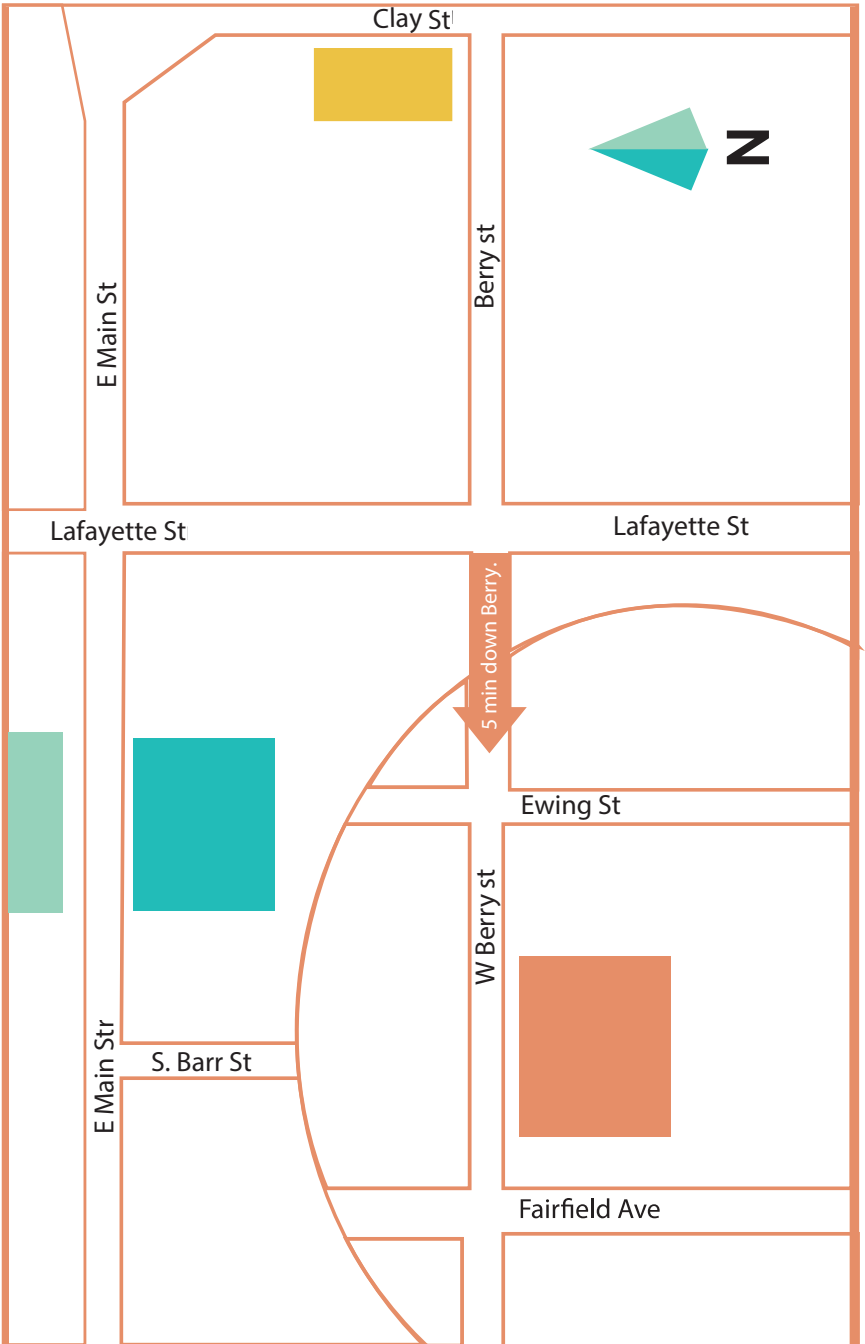

As a national manhunt ensues, the newly branded outlaws must face their options: go out in a blaze of glory or overcome their differences and survive as a family. Equal parts road comedy and rousing adventure story, director Taika Waititi (WHAT WE DO IN THE SHADOWS, upcoming THOR: RAGNORAK) masterfully weaves lively humor with emotionally honest performances by Sam Neill and Julian Dennison. A hilarious, touching crowd-pleaser, *Hunt For The Wild People* reminds us about the journey that growing up is (at any age) and those who help us along the way.

Lola Kirke (*Mistress America*) shines as Joey, an aimless young woman searching for a direction in her small town in rural Pennsylvania. A visit to an Army recruiting office appears to provide her a path but when she meets and falls in love with Rayna (Breeda Wool), a rough and tumble housewife neglected by her long-haul trucker husband, that path diverges in ways that neither woman anticipated. As Joey falls deeper in love, she begins to lose sight of what's most important to her while also becoming blind to the mistakes she is making. Building from her award-winning short, writer-director Deb Shoval's debut feature is a clear-eyed love story told with an assured voice and impressive attention to details of a small town life. Bolstered by two impressive lead performances from Kirke and Wool and a strong supporting cast, *AWOL* is a beautiful romantic drama that is both tender and tough in equal measure.

Toni trains as a boxer with her brother at a community center in Cincinnati's West End, but becomes fascinated by the dance team that also practices there. Enamored by their strength and confidence, Toni eventually joins the group, eagerly absorbing routines, mastering drills, and even piercing her ears to fit in. As she discovers the joys of dance and of female camaraderie, she grapples with her individual identity amid her newly defined social sphere. Shortly after Toni joins the team, the captain faints during practice. By the end of the week, most of the girls on the team suffer from episodes of fainting, swooning, moaning, and shaking in seemingly uncontrollable catharsis. Soon, however, the girls on the team embrace these mysterious spasms, transforming them into a rite of passage. Toni fears "the fits" but is equally afraid of losing her place just as she's found her footing. Caught between her need for control and her desire for acceptance, Toni must decide how far she will go to embody her new ideals.

When 13-year-old Jake's (Theo Taplitz) grandfather dies, his family moves from Manhattan back into his father's old Brooklyn home. There, Jake befriends the charismatic Tony (Michael Barbieri), whose single mother Leonor (Paulina Garcia, Gloria), a dressmaker from Chile, runs the shop downstairs. Soon, Jake's parents Brian (Greg Kinnear) and Kathy (Jennifer Ehle) -- one, a struggling actor, the other, a psychotherapist -- ask Leonor to sign a new, steeper lease on her store. For Leonor, the proposed new rent is untenable, and a feud ignites between the adults. At first, Jake and Tony don't seem to notice; the two boys, so different on the surface, begin to develop a formative kinship as they discover the pleasures of being young in Brooklyn. Jake aspires to be an artist, while Tony wants to be an actor, and they have dreams of going to the same prestigious arts high school together. But the children can't avoid the problems of their parents forever, and soon enough, the adult conflict intrudes upon the borders of their friendship. Directed by Ira Sachs (*Love is Strange*, *Keep the Lights On*, *Forty Shades of Blue*) with his trademark humanism and insight, *Little Men* highlights the New York City landscape with a story of life-defining friendships in the midst of familial turmoil.
